'seasons' of His Second Coming? Paul explained in verse 2 that "For yourselves know perfectly that the day of the Lord so cometh as a thief in the night." Paul asserted that Jesus would return anytime and totally unannounced (2 Peter 3:10). Thus, the Thessalonians are to be constantly 'ready', though no one knows for sure exactly when He would.

The day of the Lord really serves two purposes to two categories of people. To Christians, the day of the Lord is the day of salvation (2 Corinthians 1:14); it is a day that our redemption would be completed (1 Corinthians 5:5). It is the day that He would deliver His people Israel out of tribulation. To non-Christians, 'the day of the Lord' would refer to the day of judgement, punishment, calamity, tribulation and disaster (Acts 2:20; Malachi 4:5; Zephaniah 1:8, 2:3, Zechariah 14:1; Obadiah 1:15; Joel 1:15).

Christ's return or the coming of the 'day' itself is likened to the timing of the 'thieves.' It is because thieves usually do not preannounce their coming, so would the time when Christ returns as King of kings and Holy and Righteous Judge.

Nevertheless, Christ's Second coming would not be completely 'unknown' to nonbelievers, that is to say, that they are forewarned. However, in contrast to the believers, they would not be 'ready' for His coming because of them possessing a false sense of security in unbelief (1 Timothy 4:1; Judges 1:18) and contempt (2 Peter 2:10, 3:3,4).

That is why Apostle Paul said in verse 3a, "For when they shall say, Peace and safety; then sudden destruction cometh upon them...." This verse denotes to us that, in the later days, the world would be caught in total surprised of 'unreadiness' for the coming of Christ because of their unbelief, despite of constant warnings from God's people fore-telling them of coming judgment just like in the days of Noah (Luke 17:26,27).

They would be blinded by the god of this world believing that social and political security, economic prosperity and happiness can be achieved by human effort brought in by international bodies. Unfortunately, one day they would realize that "sudden destruction cometh upon them, as travail upon a woman with child; and they shall not escape (v.3b)."

The 'destruction' or calamity would come suddenly when the world would still be singing: "peace and safety to the world." This may refer to the seven year tribulation period prophesied in Daniel 9:27 (cf. Rev chapters 5-17) when antichrist shall rule the world and making covenant with nations during the three and a half year of his reign, which would be perceived as "peace and safety" to all the inhabitants of the earth. God willing, at this time, His people would have been already raptured before the official reign of antichrist as God would pour down His full wrath upon earth at the second half of the tribulation (Rev 16-17).

Whatever the scenario may be or whenever God plans to deliver His people out of tribulation in the future, God's people must be 'ready' for His return all the time. Christians ought not to be caught up with the spirit of laxity and indifference concerning the imminent return of our Lord and Master, Saviour and King.

How Should Christians Prepare for the Second Coming of Christ-Part 1

The world often ridicules the promised return of Christ (2 Peter 3:3,4) and this would only increase in its propensity and magnitude in their ignorance and indifference toward the impending, sudden and unannounced arrival of the divine judgment that would be consummated at the day of the Lord.

While it is a norm for the unconverted to dismiss or overlook at the importance of the Second Coming of Jesus Christ and would certainly be caught by sheer wonderment and awe; such should not be the deportment and response of every born again Christian when his Lord and Master returns as the victorious King and the Holy and Righteous Judge (Revelation 19:11-21).

How should Christians prepare for the Second Coming of Christ? Since no one would know the exact date and time of His return (Mark 13:32), does it mean that God's people should also be caught entirely by surprise and unprepared ? No, God forbid.

When Apostle Paul addressed the subject of Christ's Second Coming to the Thessalonians, he expected them to be prepared, watchful, sober and edifying in their speech and conduct in relation to their hope of the Second coming of Christ.

How should Christians today be prepared for the Second Coming of our Lord Jesus Christ in these perilous days? Let us consider the fifth chapter of Apostle Paul's first epistle to the Thessalonians to acquire a better understanding of what God wants us to know with regard to our preparation for the Second Coming of our Lord.

Be Not Caught Totally by Surprise (vv.1-3)

First, Christians are to prepare for Christ's Second Coming by being constantly 'ready' for His return. In 1 Thessalonians 5:1, Apostle Paul said, "But of the times and the seasons, brethren, ye have no need that I write unto you."

The transition word 'but', obviously denotes to the reader that Apostle Paul wanted to continue his argument, following from the end of previous chapter where he mentioned our hope of resurrection when Christ Jesus returns (1 Thessalonians 4:14-18), which should also be the source of comfort and strength for all believers (cf. 1 Thessalonians 5:11).

However, he said, "...the times and the seasons, brethren, ye have no need that I write unto you." Why is there no need for Paul to write to them about the 'times' and
